hugely popular *Star Wars* film franchise on UK coins for the first time, which involved a launch event that was live streamed on social media to a global audience. We also pay tribute to the revered British writer, poet and scholar JRR Tolkien. From collecting advice to guidance on investing in gold, this issue of *Mint Edition* offers something from all corners of the numismatic world; I hope you enjoy reading it."

A Sovereign Fit for a King

From its introduction during the reign of Henry VII, its subsequent replacement by James I and its eventual revival during the reign of George III, the story of The Sovereign has been told various times. As such, numismatists and coin collectors know the history of the coin well. However, with such emphasis placed on the world of historical coinage, it can be easy to overlook the numismatic history we are experiencing today.

The coins of His Majesty's reign represent history in the making and The Sovereign is no exception. When the coinage portrait of The King first appeared on the Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Sovereign in 2022, His Majesty became the latest in a long line of monarchs to appear on The Sovereign. Whilst the 2022 Sovereign featuring The King's portrait honoured the passing of His Majesty's mother, the release of the 2023 Coronation Sovereign commemorates The King's historic coronation, which took place on 6 May 2023.

Serving as a symbol of an important milestone in the reign of Britain's oldest ascending monarch, the 2023 Coronation Sovereign is of notable significance for a number of numismatic reasons. Firstly, the release of this collection marks only the second occasion a Sovereign has featured a portrait of King Charles III. Secondly, unlike previous coins bearing His Majesty's likeness, its obverse displays a crowned coinage portrait of The King in keeping with the ceremonial importance of the event it commemorates. Designed by Martin Jennings, the same artist behind the official coinage portrait of His Majesty that made its debut in 2022, this new design shows the monarch facing left, as per tradition, wearing a crown.

The 2023 Coronation Sovereign also rekindles a classic Sovereign custom with the inclusion of Benedetto Pistrucci's St George and the dragon design on the reverse of the coin. First appearing on The Sovereign in 1817, it has become a recurring staple on the reverse of the coin. However, Jean Baptiste Merlen's crowned shield of the Royal Arms replaced Pistrucci's design in 1825 and remained on the coin for almost half a century. Pistrucci's design eventually returned in 1871, during Queen Victoria's reign, and has appeared on the 'chief coin of the world' ever since, apart from on a few select occasions.

Departures from Pistrucci's iconic design typically take place when we release special editions of The Sovereign that commemorate significant events, such as an anniversary of the coin or a special royal event. In keeping with this trend, the Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Sovereign released in 2022 featured a new version of the Royal Coat of Arms. Designed by Jody Clark, the designer behind the fifth and final definitive coinage portrait of Queen Elizabeth II, the reverse of the coin depicts two heraldic beasts – the Lion of England and the Unicorn of Scotland – flanking a crowned shield.

In addition to featuring the crowned coinage portrait, the 2023 Coronation Sovereign is also notable as it is the first Sovereign of King Charles III's reign to feature Pistrucci's iconic St George and the dragon design. With so many firsts associated with this release, it is a coin that numismatists and collectors will appreciate today, tomorrow and for many years to come.





The Police

From their early beginnings, The Police were a maverick live band that galvanized an impressive studio sound into something otherworldly when performing.

Combining controlled energy and evocative melodies, Sting, Stewart Copeland and Andy Summers played with the improvisational instincts of a jazz trio and the raw energy of a punk rock band that blended to make them one of the definitive rock groups of the 1970s and 1980s. Now, we commemorate 'the biggest band in the world' on a UK coin for the first time.

Featuring a brand-new design, the coin is available as gold Proof, silver Proof and Brilliant Uncirculated editions. The reverse of the coin celebrates the band and authentically conveys their musical style, performance and energy, whilst taking inspiration from the album cover of their iconic and final album, *Synchronicity*. The obverse of the coin features the official coinage portrait of King Charles III designed by Martin Jennings.

The Star Wars Coin Collection

Capturing the hearts of millions around the world, the Star WarsTM films make up one of the most popular franchises in cinematic history. Now, Star Wars makes it numismatic debut with our coin collection dedicated to some of the original trilogy's most iconic duos.

In the history of cinema, few movie franchises can boast the success, global acclaim and incredible longevity of *Star Wars*. A true worldwide phenomenon, this timeless space opera saga has exploded in popularity over the last 45 years with a level of fandom that continues to reach new heights with its continued exposure to each new generation of viewers.

Despite being the brainchild of American moviemaker George Lucas, the *Star Wars* franchise has many links to the UK, which chiefly stem from the roots of the original *Star Wars* trilogy. Whilst the unique and wonderful scenery of the trilogy is set in a fictional galaxy, Borehamwood's Elstree Studios in Hertfordshire, England, was often the place where these intergalactic landscapes were built, and where much of the first three movies was filmed.

Since then, Elstree has become synonymous with *Star Wars* and there is even a large sound stage named after George Lucas in tribute to the influential director. Whilst the remaining





films in the larger 'Skywalker Saga' (namely the prequel and sequel trilogies) weren't filmed at the studios, the relationship with Elstree has seemingly come full circle with the release of the *Star Wars* spin-off series *Andor*™. Season two of the Disney+ production returned to the studios in 2022 for a large part of the shooting, bringing the story back to where it all began.

The British connection doesn't end with the shooting location, as it also extends to the cast and crew. With the bulk of the original trilogy filmed in the UK, it made sense from a logistical and financial standpoint for George Lucas to use British actors and workers in his production. As a result, a large portion of the cast was British, including those who played some of the most iconic characters in the history of the *Star Wars* franchise.

Celebrating the Life and Work of JRR Tolkien

Inventing a credible world that exists entirely in the realm of fantasy requires a powerful imagination and, in the case of John Ronald Reuel Tolkien, an abundance of intellect.



Before writing immensely popular works of fantasy fiction such as *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings*, Tolkien's mastery of languages positioned him well for his career in philology, the study of languages. Although he was well respected as an academic and scholar, first at the University of Leeds and later as a Professor at the University of Oxford, the publication of *The Hobbit* in 1937 set Tolkien on the road to global recognition. The classic fantasy tale has been a permanent fixture on children's reading lists since its release and was followed in 1954–55 by the immensely popular

The Lord of the Rings, which is widely regarded as the blueprint for modern fantasy fiction.

Whilst the fantasy world of Middle-earth and its rich mythology brought Tolkien's writing and storytelling talents to the attention of a global audience, years earlier he experienced the brutal reality of the First World War. Serving as a Second Lieutenant in the Lancashire Fusiliers, he went on active duty at the Western Front, enduring four months of trench warfare as part of the Somme offensive.

Tolkien passed away in 1973 although, 50 years later, the father of modern fantasy fiction still has a palpable influence on the genre. His trademark monogram, encircled by a runic pattern skilfully created by the artist David Lawrence, will forever grace this commemorative UK £2 coin. 'NOT ALL THOSE WHO WANDER ARE LOST', a quote from the poem 'The Riddle of Strider', which features in Tolkien's *The Fellowship of the Ring*, serves as the coin's edge inscription.

Celebrating The King's Coronation at The Royal Mint Experience

As the clock struck 12am on Saturday, 6 May 2023, The Royal Mint Experience embarked on the first tour of its 24-hour event celebrating the coronation of King Charles III. Visitors arrived before sunrise and after sunset, as tours commenced every 20 minutes throughout the day.

Those in attendance had the opportunity to strike their own Brilliant Uncirculated Coronation UK 50p coins, housed in exclusive packaging only available between midnight and 11.59pm on the day of the coronation. They were also amongst the first to experience 'Crowned: The Making of a Monarch', a brand-new exhibition that explores coronation traditions and The Royal Mint's

role during changes in the British monarchy. Highlights of this exhibition include a shield containing a coin from every reign since William I (*r.* 1066–87) through to King Charles III, as well as the opportunity to sit in a replica of the Coronation Chair.

Every area of The Royal Mint Experience was involved in the event – even the car park was

transformed into a fairground with classic games, including hook-a-duck and tin can alley. 'Urban Markets' also joined the festivities, providing stalls selling a range of local produce, including crafts, food and dog treats. Our café also offered a celebratory range of snacks fit for a street party, which visitors enjoyed as they watched the coronation unfold live on screens around the venue.

Uncover the Stories Behind Your Collections

With more than 1,100 years of experience making British coins, The Royal Mint is at the heart of collecting. Collecting is a varied and rewarding hobby that allows you to explore your passion in more detail, curating a collection that ignites your imagination. Perhaps you started your collecting journey when you discovered The Royal Mint had commemorated one of your favourite themes on a coin? However you got started, there is so much more to the coins in your collection than their face value.

Uncover the Stories Behind Your Collections

Each coin comes with a story, steeped in the history of how it was made and why that theme became commemorated on coinage. Even circulating coins have their own fascinating stories. You can trace the story of the British monarchy through the coinage portraits that appear on the obverse of circulating coins, from Alfred the Great to Britain's more recent monarchs.

The coinage of Queen Elizabeth II is an interesting example, as it featured five portraits during her reign.



Queen Elizabeth II acceded to the throne in 1952 and went on to reign for more than 70 years. During this time, the coinage of Queen Elizabeth II saw some significant changes. Mary Gillick designed the first coinage portrait of the monarch and – even though it was replaced after decimalisation – the beautiful portrait remained on Maundy money until the end of her reign.

Decimalisation was the biggest change to the nation's coinage throughout its history. This saw the United Kingdom adopt a decimal currency to replace the system of pounds, shillings and pence that had been in place for centuries. To complete this enormous task, The Royal Mint had to relocate to larger, purpose-built premises in Llantrisant, South Wales.

A coinage portrait designed by Arnold Machin RA replaced the Mary Gillick portrait. Machin also designed a new portrait for British stamps, and the artist used the coinage portrait he had created for inspiration. The new portrait remained on stamps until the end of Queen Elizabeth II's reign. Three more portraits featured on the coinage of Queen Elizabeth II during her reign until her sad passing in September 2022, when His Majesty King Charles III acceded to the throne.

The accessions and successions of monarchs is only one of many stories that coins can tell. The introduction of new denominations holds a wealth of information too, such as our flagship coin, The Sovereign. First introduced during the reign of Henry VII, the king chose the name 'Sovereign' for his 'new money of gold' to establish the legitimacy and authority of the new Tudor dynasty. The Sovereign was replaced during the reign of James I by another gold coin and was then reintroduced during the reign of George III, when the need arose for a coin with a value of 20 shillings.

Italian engraver Benedetto Pistrucci was commissioned to design the reverse for this new Sovereign, and his famous St George and the dragon design was the result of much hard work between the engraver and the Master of the Mint, William Wellesley Pole. This beautiful design has since enjoyed longevity, appearing on Sovereigns struck for every monarch since the reign of Queen Victoria. It has only been replaced very rarely in favour of one-year issues marking special occasions for the British monarchy.


